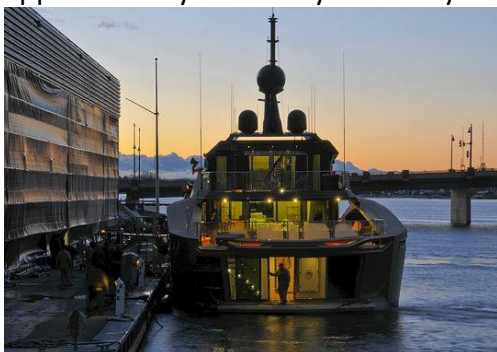

After weeks of sea trials, Palmer Johnson Yacht's new 48M SuperSport the Khalilah departed Saturday morning for delivery to its owner.

A crew from Palmer Johnson took the yacht away to train the crew of the new owners. It will take approximately 14-22 days for the yacht to make it out to sea and its first destination, said to be Florida.
